

Three Design Alternatives

Concept 1


Concept 1 is a zen influenced design. The ciruculation of this concept in going around a central focal point, an open room made from bamboo walls, the bamboo will grow through the opening in the ceiling. It acts like a wind and sound barrier for those who sit inside. There is a giant rock slab in the middle that acts as a small stage and as a meditation area. The walls of the courtyard will be covered with verticle wooden slates, giving the illusion of even more height to the room.


Concept 2


Concept 2 is a hanging garden design. The ground plane offers seating and tables. There is a giant spiral floor design in the center of the room, which will be the drain. The main focal point of this concept are the hanging planters, sculptures, and lights from above. These sculptures will be based off of the original sculpture found in the center of the courtyard once before. The walls will be painted black with ivy growing from the ground up. The black represents the darkness inside the theaters and the sculptures under the spot light of the sun. At night, spot lights will shine at the sculptures above.


Concept 3

Concept 3 is based on a central focal point design. There is a mount in the middle of the courtyard where a tree grows tall and reaches through the ceiling hole. It represents every actor or actress's journey towards the lime light. There are sculptures of mask on the mount below the tree representing those who have been on the theater journey. The walls will green walls and out of east and west side of the walls, there will be two giant mask sculptures and hands reaching out towards the center of the room and towards the light from the ceiling. These sculptures represent the spirits of the students whom strive towards the stage.


