Site Zones

ZONE 1

Zone 1 encompasses an existing parking lot slated center, and borders Dallas Dr., which leads to the parking structure. Access to the loading area must be maintained.

ZONE 2

Zone 2 has large open spaces with oak trees and paths, a swale and will be the new front entrance of the civic center.

ZONE 3

Zone 3 boarders the parking lot behind The Lakes shopping center, the new design must be adaptable to accommodate the future residential building increase as it approached the loading dock area.

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
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



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OPPORTUNITIES

- Existing Parking Lot: Will be demolished opening up more usable space
- 2 Terrace Planter: Can be removed to create better building entrance
- Outdoor Room: Can be purposed for seating/ gathering space
- **Connection:** Space to make connections to adjacent sites
- 5 Swale: Aesthetically nice to look at and great design to keep water controlled during storms
- 6 Open Space: Space to create a plaza for farmers markets and other community events
- 7 Oak Grove: Shady space to gather under during hot days and for children to play
- 8 Round-about: Can create an easy drop off and valet space for event
- 9 Ramp: Interesting architectural feature creating usable space underneath
- (10) Buffer: To limit road noise from Thousand Oaks

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
CONSTRAINTS

- **High Volume Traffic:** Noise from both Thousand Oaks Blvd and the Freeway
- 2 Building Entrances: Poor pedestrian access and limited signage confusing
- 3 Narrow Sidewalks: Poor circulation
- **Transit Hub**: Not comfortable or shaded for
- Protected Oak Woodland: Unable to remove trees, need to work around them
- **Minimal Connection to Adjacent Sites:** No direct connection
- 7 Loading Dock Remaining: Must keep vehicle access
- 8 Elevation Change: Site has various elevations
- 9 Neglected Outdoor Event Space: contains protected oaks
- Future Development Adjacent: will affect sense of space

Hollander believes his role was to "help Steven Holl's vision grow." That vision was to use the landscape to create a "living memorial to Kennedy," who was assassinated in 1963. Through seasonal change, the landscape itself gives a performance imbued with meaning.

For example, a grove of 35 prehistoric Ginkgo trees — 35 because Kennedy was the 35th president — at the far end of the landscape turn a bright yellow in autumn and drop all their leaves at once around the time that Kennedy was assassinated."

"The Sculpture Exhibition in Civic Center Park is an integral feature of the Newport Beach Civic Center. Civic Center Park, which turned nearly half a million square feet of undeveloped land into a new public park, was designed by renowned landscape architectural firm Peter Walker and Partners (PWP). The City Arts Commission determined that a rotating exhibition, in which pieces are loaned for a 2-year period, was an optimal approach to bring sculpture to the City in a cost-efficient manner. In 2013, the Newport Beach City Council authorized the City Arts Commission to implement an inaugural rotational sculpture exhibit in Civic Center Park."

- Preserve existing oak trees by establishing a protection zone to separate them from other garden areas.
- Plant new native trees to ensure long-term growth and health of the ecosystem.
- Install informational signage to raise awareness about the importance of native plant conservation.
- Develop an educational space to teach about the native flora.
- Remove invasive species to promote the health of native plants.
- Design pathways that minimize soil compaction and protect root systems.
- Create shaded rest areas to enhance visitor enjoyment and encourage longer stays.






Playground Enlargement
