

DRAWING NOTES

\* The Ralph Freud Playhouse and The Little
Theater are full scale theaters located in the
Macgowan Hall. They can accommodate
drama, music and dance productions as well
as speaker presentations, panel discussions
and ceremonies. The theaters seats up to
586 and 200 people, respectively.

\* The prevailing wind direction in Los Angeles is from the Southwest, except for the Santa Ana winds, which are common during the cooler months of the year, occurring from September through May.

\* Temperature - The average high and low temperatures are listed monthly for Los Angeles in degrees Fahrenheit. Source: NOAA National Centers for Environmental Information (NCEI)





### CONCEPT 1

The focal point of the space is the "Tower of Mask" sculpture. This design concept aims to be cost-effective by incorporating existing elements like two of the trees and the drainage system.

- \* A wood art mural will be placed on the vestibule wall to help dampen echoes.
- \* The walls will receive a fresh coat of paint to create a more colorful and vibrant atmosphere.
- \* The wall painting and mural will be designed to be social media-friendly.
- \* The main entrance door will be positioned in the center.
- \* New cement benches will be installed.
- \* The addition of a new cement floor with a square pattern is proposed.
- \* Update the ceiling lights.
- Floor lamps will illuminate the "Tower of Mask" sculpture.
- \* Additional large wooden benches will be added.
- \* New planters will accompany the large benches.





## CONCEPT 2

The "Tower of Masks" sculpture will remain the focal point, complemented by wood art panels showcasing faces of renowned UCLA alumni artists along the upper

Organic elements like wooden benches and a vertical garden will be incorporated into the design.

- \* Additional trees will be planted in new planters to enhance the environment.
- \* A multipurpose ticketing/information/convenience area will be established, featuring a new counter for patrons.
- \* The main entrance door will be centrally positioned.
- \* A new lighting system will be implemented for the art panels and vertical garden.
- \* Floor lamps will provide illumination for the sculpture.
- \* New ceiling lights will be installed.
- \* New seating furniture will be arranged in the upper left corner.
- \* Blue stone floor tiles will be introduced.
- \* Update the drainage system.





# CONCEPT 3

The "Tower of Masks" sculpture will stay as the centerpiece, complemented by wood art panels showcasing faces of distinguished UCLA alumni artists on the upper walls. To enhance tranquility and minimize external noise, a wall fountain will be installed. This design prioritizes the use of upscale, sophisticated materials.

- \* Creation of a versatile ticketing/info/convenience space featuring a new counter for patrons.
- \* Planting of additional trees in new planters to enhance the environment.
- \* Incorporation of a glass ceiling to create a greenhouse-inspired design.
- \* Installation of new modern seating areas overlooking the sculpture and exterior surroundings.
- \* Introduction of removable bench seating overlooking the sculpture and fountain.
- \* Implementation of a new modern seating area on the left edge.
- \* Use of confetti style Terrazzo Italian tiles for the floors.
- \* Installation of a new lighting system for the ceiling, sculpture, panels, and fountain.


Three Designs Alternatives: Low, Medium and High Budgets



All three designs include the reinstatement of the "Tower of Mask" sculpture to its original placement, as it effectively symbolizes the theater and arts department.



The Tower of Mask sculpture stands tall, embodying the spirit of the theater and arts department.


Respecting the architectural legacy, pedestrian circulation is improved, and the incorporation of new modern seating areas offers a contemporary retreat within the plaza.

A peaceful water feature adds serenity, isolating the plaza from outside disturbances.


Overhead, a modern glass ceiling illuminates the space, infusing it with energy and vitality.


